Emergency Overview

Containment Procedures

Wear NIOSH approved personal protective equipment (PPE). Contain spill. Do not allow material to run into sewers and drains.

Handling Procedures

Keep containers closed. Store in a cool, dry place. Avoid freezing. Store at temperatures above 31 degrees Fahrenheit.

A: Product Exposure Limits

Product not tested for exposure limits.

B: Component Exposure Limits

This product may contains trace amounts (<0.0001 %) of residual ethylene oxide (EO) and propylene oxide (PO), a condition which creates a very slight potential for accumulation in the headspace of shipping and storage containers. The concentration of EO & PO in the head space are not there in enough amounts to cause the OSHA 0.5 ppm action level for exposure. Handle product as stated in this MSDS and the trace amounts of EO & PO are not expected to result in acute or chronic hazards. The presence of these trace residual amounts are not expected to result in any short term or long term hazard. Use NIOSH approved Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) when manufacturing, and when spraying solutions.

Provide for protection of employees and local residents. In the event of fire, evacuate residents who are downwind of fire. Prevent unauthorized entry to the fire area. Have a medical check made of employees that may have been exposed to fumes from a fire.
